
TT Rockstars

Reception

We have been learning all about various forms of transport and this week, we have looked at the evolution of trains. We learnt about the steam engine and how modern trains are mostly electric. We engaged with various activities linked to transport, such as building cars and train tracks.

We are noticing patterns and creating our own patterns using peg boards to create a repeated pattern of our own choice.



The children have completed some superb writing, creating their own invitation to their own piano concert, based on the story "The Bear and the Piano". They also created his home, which is the forest, using various resources.



In art, we have created our own sock puppets and used sewing resources to create our own play props. We discussed and explained the process involved in creating this prop and learnt how to create a basic stitch safely and effectively.

Connor has made a spaceship at home - just wow! What a great way to problem solve and enjoy yourself.

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
Enormous thanks to Zara and Anayah who chose to tidy the class library brilliant girls. Year 4 are showing how to spend their free time constructivelywell done.






<u>Year 5</u>
