## **Dear Families**

Our first week back seems to have flown past. It has been a very busy week in school. 4 Year 1 children and 4 Year 2 children took part in a football festival at Brookvale Academy led by Aston Villa coaches. They behaved perfectly and, as always, were a credit to our school.

Year 4 completed their multiplication tables check – well done, children. Even when you know your times tables, it is really hard to answer random questions under timed conditions. They complete the tests on iPads and they are given just 6 seconds to read the calculation, work out the answer and then type their answer. They have been practising a lot recently but not knowing which 25 calculations they will be asked to complete – anything up to 12 x 12 – shows why it is really important for children to learn all the tables off by heart. This knowledge will help them in many different aspects of mathematics too. It really is a very important skill to have. A huge 'well done' also goes to Miss Moore for all her help in supporting the children.

Benjamin Zephaniah's memorial is on Monday afternoon. Parents who have requested that they attend, please arrive at school at 1pm. We will be outside on the grass so you will not need to go to the school office. There will be lots of photographs and film recorded and this will be uploaded onto social media. ATLP are also trying to invite the press so we may make the local news too!

tractor and horses. We also enjoyed our coach ride, which is another form of transport, linked to our topic this term.












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## Year 1
