Swimming

Children in Year 4 will be taking part in 10 days of intensive swimming at Wyndley Swimming Baths and trained swimming teachers will work with the children. Boys need to wear swimming trunks and girls a swimming costume (not a bikini) with tight fitting leggings if they wish. No loose fitting clothes will be allowed. 
Snapshots of the Week!

Reception

In Reception, we have been learning about a story called *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* and engaged with various crafts such as leaf rubbings and a caterpillar folding activity using strips of paper.



We have looked at the life cycle of a butterfly and used words such as metamorphosis to describe the changes it goes through. We described the character using our own ideas and writing sentences independently.




In maths, we have practised taking away and counting back. We recapped finding 1 less and recognition of numbers beyond 10.



As part of our minibeasts and growth topic, we have experimented with growing plants that do not need soil, such as runner beans. We have observed the bean sprouting and growing when using paper towels and water; we used see through jar or cups. We will continue to observe them growing for the rest of the term.



All the children in Year 2 have increased their understanding about the development of plants.








Maths this week was a challenge; they had to show their skills with tally charts. Well done, children.

Year 3 children enjoyed learning about money this week. They practised making different amounts, learnt how to convert from pounds to pence and discussed approximately how much things they like cost.







Year 4

Year 4 were discussing refugees after reading, My Name Is Not Refugee. Some fantastic research and writing.

















Year 5

This will be from 3.20pm to 4:00pm.


Please do come and have a look, as there will be a range on stimulating books and stationery.
