#### Swimming

Children in Years 4 and 5 will be taking part in 10 days of intensive swimming at Wyndley Swimming Baths and trained swimming teachers will work with the children. This is part of the National Curriculum and children are expected to attend. <u>Jewellery is not permitted to be worn</u>. Boys need to wear swimming trunks and girls a swimming costume (not a bikini) with tight fitting leggings if they wish. No loose fitting clothes will be allowed.


Please see PE days below for each class. Children need to come to school on these days in their PE kits. Please do not send them in wearing jeans. Thank you.



# **Snapshots of the Week!**

### **Reception**

### Minibeast junk modelling:

In Reception, we have been creating junk modelling minibeasts and have enjoyed learning about their various habitats. We have been practising some key vocabulary such as insects, habitat and metamorphosis!




In literacy, we have been reading Supermarket Zoo and role playing our own supermarket and practised our fine motor skills by scooping pretend food at the deli.

We have also created daily routine maps by drawing pictures and labelling what we do each day and how to get ready to go shopping.

### <u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have been following algorithms in computing this week. They had to follow instructions and see if they got to the same point as everyone else. We had a bit of confusion between left and right so we had to do some debugging of our following of the instructions. Lots more fun to come with algorithms!



### <u>Year 2</u>

In English, we have been using adjectives and verbs in our writing.

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In maths, we have been multiplying and dividing by 2, 5 and 10.



We started athletics in PE lessons and the children practised underarm throws this week. They learnt how to transfer weight forwards as the arm swings through from the back to the front to release the object. The children particularly enjoyed playing noughts and crosses with bean bags.

This week, the children in Year 5 were using Chrome music lab on the iPads. They were using digital notes and instruments to create their own tunes.












# <u>Year 6</u>

In design and technology, Year 6 have been designing a steady hand game ready to make over the next couple of weeks.



Year 6 have also been scientists. They were investigating how a shadow can be manipulated by changing the positioning of the light source. They explored what happens to a shadow when the light was moved closer towards the object and what happened when it was moved further away as well as from different angles.
