There are different games they can play on TTRS. For example, the 'Jamming' game allows them to choose the times tables they would like to focus on and they will only receive questions on those. Any questions, please contact your class teacher or Miss Williams

Year 4 will have their Multiplication Tables Check in June 2024 and the government's expectation is that they score 25/25. By the end of Year 4, children should know all the times tables up to 12 x 12.




## <u>Year 1</u>

This week, Year 1 have been looking at the seasons in science. We made our own season spinner which shows the weather and months in each season. We are definitely getting into winter now, brrrrr!




## <u>Year 2</u>


# <u>Year 4</u>
