

Attendance

Please ensure that if your child is well enough to attend school, that they do. Last academic year, we had far too many children taken out of school to go abroad for various reasons. If your child is absent a lot due to illness, we will meet with you to offer support and ways to move forward: this may involve contacting your GP to ask for support or making a hospital referral.

The government expect children to have at least 96% attendance. If attendance is below 90%, interventions are then applied to try and support you and your child. We understand that children are ill and can support you with this, but please DO NOT take your child out of school for holidays or visits abroad. This seriously impacts their education and data from last academic year has proved this.

Last year, parents were fined because of their child's poor attendance. Please help us to improve attendance this year. Thank you.

Entering School/Leaving School

Please see below the doors your children will use when they arrive at school in the morning and go home from in the afternoon.

Reception – children will arrive at school and go home using the gate into the little playground. This gate will be opened by the Reception staff. Please do not come through the gate unless a member of the Reception team invites you. Lots of people in the playground can cause a safeguarding risk with too many people for the Reception staff to try and focus on.

Year 1 – children will enter school through the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue. They will leave through the fire exit in the Year 1 classroom. Please stand so the members of staff can see you and they will call your child. Please do not stand on the steps.

Year 2 – children can enter school through the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue or the Year 6 door in the big playground. They will leave via the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue.

Year 3 – children can enter school through the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue or the Year 6 door in the big playground. They will leave via the office entrance in the big playground.

Year 4 - children can enter school through the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue or the Year 6 door in the big playground. They will leave via the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue.

Year 5 - children can enter school through the ramp entrance on Deykin Avenue or the Year 6 door in the big playground. They will leave via the Year 6 door in the big playground.

The gates are set on a timer and will automatically open. Please do not ring the office or press the buzzer for the office staff to open the gates early. They will automatically open at the pre-set times.

Home time is 3:20pm and the children will not come out of school before this time. If your child's class is a little late leaving, please be patient as there will be a valid reason for this. Please do not shout at the staff that they are late. This is not the behaviour we want our children to witness.

English and Mathematics Workshops

Between now and October half term, each class will have an English workshop and you will receive an invite to attend. The teacher and teaching assistant will share with you the reading and writing skills your child is developing and how you can help them at home. For children in Reception and Year 1, this will also include phonics.

Between October half term and December, each class will have a mathematics workshop and you will receive an invite to attend. Calculation methods will be shared with you as well as problems solving activities you can help your child with at home.
