## <u>Attendance</u>

We had a lot of sickness last half term. Lots of nasty bugs seem to have passed around different classrooms resulting in children being absent with sore throats, upset stomachs and temperatures. Hopefully, following a week off, a lot of these bugs will have gone away. While we do want good attendance in school, we do ask that you keep your children at home if they have been sick or are too ill to attend school. If your child comes to school and appears unwell and tells us they have been sick at home, we will ring you to check if this is correct and to ask you to collect your child if necessary.

#### **Dolce - Lunches**

Please remember to book your child's lunch using the School Grid app/website. If your child has a lunch but it has not been ordered, they will be offered a jacket potato and many children do not like this option.

It is very easy to order your child's meals. You can order them every day, for a whole week or even for a term. If your child is entitled to free school meals, it really is worth ordering them as they will receive a hot meal. If you pay for your child's meal, you can either set up a direct debit to pay, or pay an amount of your choice and then keep topping up as you run out of credit.

If you are having problems with using the School Grid (the app/website used by Dolce), please see Mrs Sayed or Mrs Dargan and they can support you and show you what to do.

# Safeguarding

Being able to access the internet is a valuable tool for all of us. It provides us with the opportunity to research information, play games and to stay in contact with friends and family who live a long way away. It can be great. However, it can also be a dangerous place to be if parental controls are not set, or if your children access content that is not appropriate for their age. You may think they are watching a music video, or a cartoon, but they could have accidentally clicked on a pop up and are now faced with inappropriate material.

## **TT Rockstars**

Please encourage your children (particularly those in Year 2 and above) to play on TT Rockstars regularly. It is a wonderful resource to help children learn their times tables. There are different games they can play on TTRS. For example, the 'Jamming' game allows them to choose the times tables they would like to focus on and they will only receive questions on those. Any questions, please contact your class teacher or Miss Williams

Year 4 will have their Multiplication Tables Check in June 2024 and the government's expectation is that they score 25/25. By the end of Year 4, children should know all the times tables up to 12 x 12.





## **Parent View Responses**

- 58 parents completed a questionnaire. Some results do not add to 100% due to rounding up or down to the nearest 1%.
- 100% agreed their child was happy at our school.
- 100% said their child feels safe in our school.
- 98% said our pupils are well behaved. 2% did not know.
- 55% said their child had not been bullied. 7% didn't know. 26% said their child had been bullied but it had been dealt with effectively. 12% disagreed.
- 97% agreed the school tells you what your child will learn during the year. 4% disagreed. (Our curriculum maps are on our website and you were sent a copy in September.)
- 26% said they had not raised concerns. 3% did not know. 66% said concerns have been dealt with properly. 5% disagreed that concerns have been dealt with properly.
- 100% agreed their child has special educational needs and the school provides your child with the support they need in order to succeed.
- 5% did not know if the school has high expectations for your children. 2% said we do not. 94% said we do.
- 95% said your child does well at our school. 2% didn't know and 3% said their child does not do well.
- 95% said we let you know how your child is doing. 2% didn't know and 3% disagreed. We hold 3 parent consultation meetings during the year and send out a written report to parents in July. There is also the opportunity to ask your child's teacher how they are doing at the end of the day. If the teacher has concerns about your child, they will contact you and ask to come in and speak to them about this.
- 93% agreed there is a good range of subjects available to your child. 3% didn't know and 3% disagreed.
  We teach the full National Curriculum. Subjects we teach are: reading, writing, mathematics, science,
  computing, physical education (PE), religious education (RE), history, geography, art, design technology
  (DT), music, Spanish (Years 3-6), phonics (Reception and Y1 and children in Y2 upwards who still need
  phonics support) and relationships and health education (RHE). We have no room on timetables to
  teach anything else!
- 82% agreed their child can take part in clubs and activities. 9% didn't know and 8% disagreed. We are aware that there are not as many clubs as we would like. This is something we are trying to improve.
- 88% agreed we support your child's wider personal development. 7% didn't know and 5% disagreed.
- 93% would recommend our school to another parent and 7% would not.

Thank you to everyone who completed this questionnaire. We will now look to see how we can improve our school based on these findings.

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
